**Re: *Seeming corrupt activity***

I refer to my letter to Natalie O'Halloran, formerly of the Law Society of NSW, of 16<sup>th</sup> October 2017, and my subsequent letter to you of 27<sup>th</sup> November 2017. I **attach** a copy of both of those pieces of correspondence.

You will see that I pose the same question to both Ms O'Halloran and yourself, in that I ask if an inducement had been received in order to cover up solicitor misconduct. Such question was put to you both due to proper procedures not having taken place in relation to my complaint about Fiona Seaton, formerly of Turner Freeman Lawyers, and the improper and obvious covering up of conduct issues.

No party has responded to the question of a possible inducement having been received, and indeed no response was received at all by any party to my letters of 16<sup>th</sup> October 2017 and 27<sup>th</sup> November 2017.

You yourself admit that proper procedures did not take place in relation to my complaint about Fiona Seaton. You state in your letter of 17<sup>th</sup> November 2017, among other things:

*"I acknowledge the Law Society did not, in its reasons, refer to any material establishing a basis for Ms Seaton's statement."*

As stated in my letter to you of 27<sup>th</sup> November 2017, the Law Society must seek supporting documentation in relation to complaints, which it did not do and therefore provided clear advantage to the solicitor about whom I complained and improperly dismissed my complaint despite clear conduct issues.


I also provide to you a copy of my letter to Elizabeth Barnes, formerly of the Law Society of NSW of 12<sup>th</sup> September 2017.
