Re: Corruption

I refer to the above and to my first of two E-mails to Detective Senior Constable Michael Adams of the NSW Police of yesterday's date, which was copied to your office.

I refer in particular to the two following paragraphs contained in such E-mail:

"Also, and importantly, you made mention when attending my home yesterday that in the latter part of 2015, John McKenzie was interviewed by Detective Senior Constable James Pantos in relation to allegations of fraud on the part of Terence Goldberg, and in which the NSW Police has since determined that no offence had occurred.

As stated above, the attached letters lay out in very clear detail the criminal activities of Mr Goldberg. It therefore calls into question the information or advices as offered to the NSW Police by John McKenzie during his interview with Detective Senior Constable Pantos during the original fraud investigation."


Given that no action has been taken in relation to Terence Goldberg's improper conduct, there are a limited number of permutations in relation to the above:

- The officer concerned mistook or misrepresented what you told him; or
- You provided false information to the NSW Police during a fraud investigation; or
- An agreement was reached between you both in order to protect the wrongdoer.

Given the obviousness of the fraud that has taken place, are you able to explain to me how Detective Senior Constable James Pantos left his formal interview with you determining incorrectly that no criminal activity had occurred?
